Projects

The Admiral Desmond Piers Naval Association has two important projects underway at this time.

- (1) It has been approved by the membership that the club shall erect a monument to the memory of our namesake Admiral Desmond Piers. A small committee has been formed, Chaired by Shipmate "Doc" Halliday and much work and planning has already been done. Approval has been given by Mrs. Janet Piers to proceed with the proposal; Chester Municipal Council was given all the specs and are providing space to erect the monument. Three monument companies were asked for quotes which would include maximum costs with nothing hidden. The quotes were all under \$15,000.00 installed. Some details of construction asked for are: 6 ½ feet tall, 10 inches thick, logos, crests, a picture of Debby, bases, quality, African black granite etc. At the Annual General Meeting of the RCNA approval was asked for and given to canvass all 32 RCNA Clubs in Canada for donations to assist with this worthy cause. Letters have been sent to all and some donations have already been received. It is planned to have this project completed sometime around Battle-of-the-Atlantic Sunday 2007. Donations are solicited from anyone wishing to help perpetuate the memory of Admiral Piers. Please make cheques payable to Admiral Desmond Piers Memorial Fund and send to the ADPNA.

- (2) As was described in our last Newsletter, the Admiral Desmond Piers Naval Association has initiated a Bursary to go to a deserving Sea Cadet to pursue career goals at a recognized University, College or Community College. We have since learned that Mrs. Janet Piers wishes to establish a living memorial to her late husband Admiral Desmond Piers. She plans to donate a substantial sum to sustain this memorial at no cost to us. Both Scholarships, Admiral Desmond Piers Memorial Scholarship Trust and Admiral Desmond Piers Naval Association Bursary will be administered by the ADPNA and both will be available to an applicable Sea Cadet serving with a Corps' from Chester to Yarmouth to Cornwallis. Donations are solicited to help with our bursary which we consider a worthy cause. If you do not wish to make a donation, please support our money raising efforts such as raffles etc. **Remember: These Cadets are our future.**

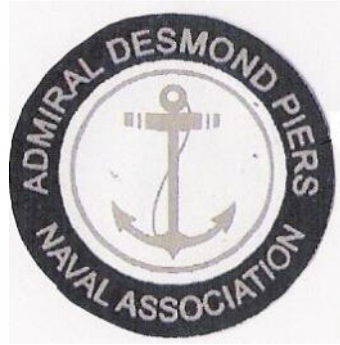
